Remembrance Cranes memorialize someone or something in a natural, peaceful way, forever. As a beautiful keepsake, it has cultural Japanese and Jewish significance. In Asia, a crane stands for *peace, healing and long-life*. In Judaism a *natural* rock can be placed on a grave and has permanence; containing a rock, it will help you hold onto someone or something in a peaceful way *forever*. Remembrance Cranes can be the uplifting centerpiece on a table, placed in the garden, or rest by a beloved one's stone. It comes with the shimmering plastic crane (with 4 inch long wings) in your color choice, a river stone, a short poem, and optionally is available with a polymer clay-coated wooden post or mini-stand. Please enjoy holding onto life with this origami crane, whether a gift for the remembered, in celebration or for everyday cheer.

The story behind this piece: It was born upon the loss of Lisa's Grandpa Joe and commemorated his 100 years of Jewish life. A speech was written for the burial ceremony and was turned into the poetic Resting Prayer, featured on the right.
